Summary of key findings

This provision meets requirements

- The provider offers fully funded, inclusive holiday care for eligible children with special educational needs and/or disabilities. She works closely with other professionals and parents, to support children in their current stage of learning. For example, she works closely with schools to fully understand children's needs and support any necessary behaviour interventions that are in place. Furthermore, the provider explains how she visits each family at home to assess and discuss each child's individual needs before they attend the playscheme.
- The provider explains her understanding of supporting children's well-being. She clearly describes the importance of organising experiences that widen children's knowledge. The provider uses group activities to build on children's social communication skills and broaden their vocabulary. For example, during mealtimes, children sit in small groups and have meaningful discussions.
- The provider knows how to support children's independence. She discusses the importance of providing children with opportunities to learn how to carry out routines and personal risk assessments for themselves.
- The provider has a robust recruitment procedure. She understands how to ensure staff are and remain suitable to work with children. The provider ensures all staff complete regular training to build on their knowledge and skills.
- The provider is passionate about providing an environment that enhances children's understanding of how to lead a healthy lifestyle. She describes how she has previously introduced a 'fruit and veg buffet' initiative, to encourage children to try new foods. The provider also explains how she intends for staff to encourage children to enjoy the outdoor environment and support them to understand the importance of keeping active.
- The provider has a robust safeguarding policy in place. She can clearly explain the procedures staff must follow should they be concerned about the suitability of an adult working with children. The provider ensures that all staff have a secure knowledge of how to identify any signs of abuse, for example female genital mutilation. Staff complete rigorous risk assessments for their trips out, to ensure outings remain suitable and fully accessible to all children.

There were no children in the early years age range present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no early years children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
